BY the end of the year, Peter Harris, of Terrigal, will have been everywhere, man.

"I am enjoying getting to know each town and learning more about Australia in the process."

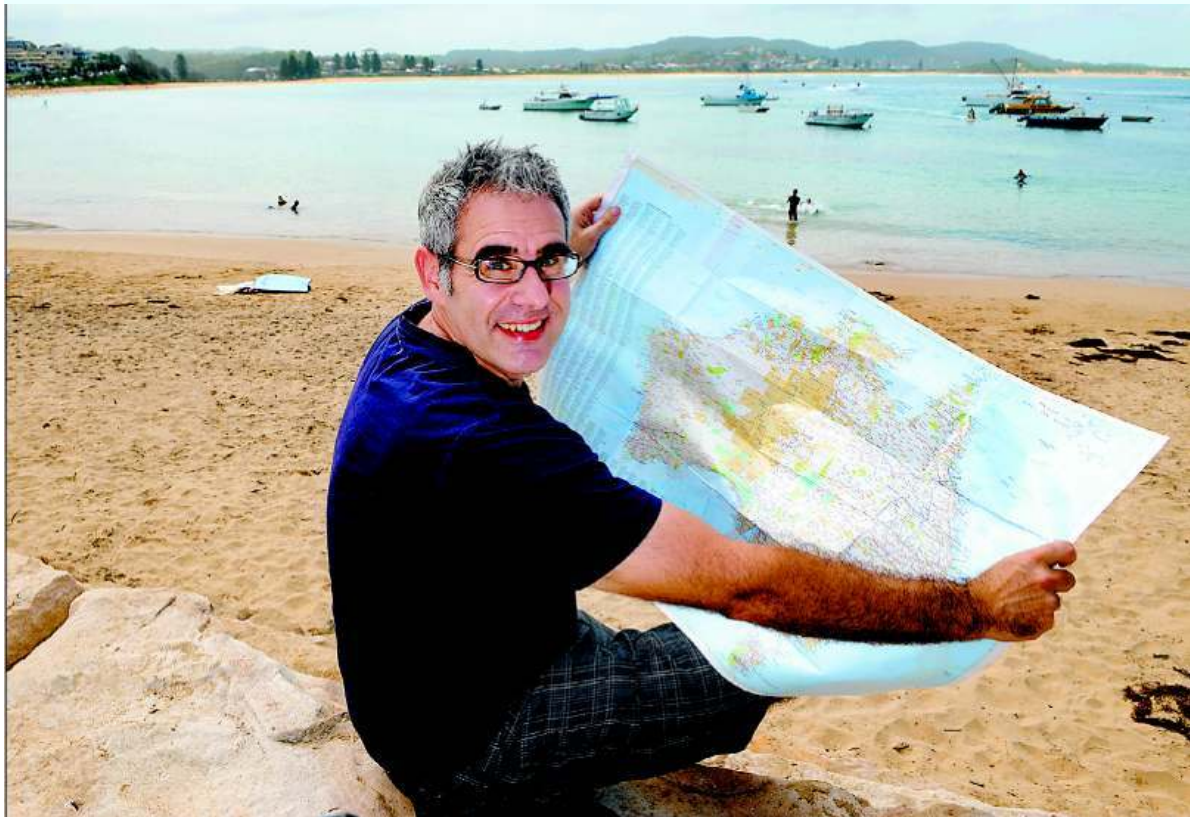
Some of the place listed are not even towns, a few are railway
