From ghost towns to the nation's capital, Peter will travel through 93 destinations, with Ulladulla number 30 on his itinerary.

"I aim to visit every location by the end of the year, but I'm taking my time," Peter said after stopping off in Ulladulla last week.

"I am enjoying getting to know each

town and learning more about Australia in the process."

During his visit to Ulladulla, Peter enjoyed lunch by the harbour, explored the Warden Head Lighthouse and photographed Pigeon House Mountain.

Peter said all donations received would go directly to the Fred Hollows Foundation.

"I am passionate about the work of Fred Hollows," he said.

"He was not simply a skilled eye surgeon, but a champion of human rights and social justice."

In 1962 Australian Geoff Mack wrote the lyrics to 'I've Been Everywhere', a song listing 93 Australian destinations

linked only by their ability to rhyme with each other.

Now, 48 years later, Peter's adventure will take him to every Australian state, except Western Australia and Tasmania, and he's loving every minute of it.

"I'm discovering just how big Australia really is and enjoying meeting new people in every township and city.

"I'm looking forward to being able to sing, 'I've been everywhere, man' and to have actually been there and done it."
